




TEXTILE HEMP, A RISING DYNAMIC



Chinese acreage of textile Hemp vs. Flax (est.)

	2022	2023	2024
Hemp dedicated to textile	12 000	13 000	27 000
Flax	5 000	5 000	7000

- Textile hemp acreage have doubled in one year in China
- Note also that there is a rise in flax acreage, consequently the combination flax/textile hemp has doubled in two years



Today there is no offer for fine 100% hemp yarn/fabric that guarantees transparency, responsible practices, or traceability.

European hemp long fibre R&D aims to solve this gap.

3 PILOT ACTIONS

- Implementing textile hemp at the level of cultivation, mechanization of harvesting and scutching – production of agricultural data
- 2. Improve and implement the processing of textile hemp: yarn, fabric and knitwear, finished products, and recycling solutions.
- 3. Training/Targeted Dissemination: Farmers, Manufacturers, Designers, and Brands

- → Interreg North-West Europe NWE (NWE) project
- → March 2023-2026
- → Budget: €3.8M ERDF 2.286.794 €
- → 11 partners
- → Supported by Valbiom, the Walloon association for sustainable solutions in the bio-based economy
